

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY
CITY/COUNTY UTILITY COMMISSION MEETING
December 8, 2014

Distribution/Collection

The Utility Commission authorized the execution of various agreements regarding proposed water and/or sanitary sewer improvements installed within various developments. The total estimated cost of all water improvements are \$47,510 and sewer improvements are \$118,190.

The Utility Commission awarded a contract to **Charles D. Lowder, Inc.** in the estimated amount of \$6,399,703 for the 28th Street Drainage Improvements and Water and Sewer Rehabilitation Project.

The Utility Commission awarded a contract to **River Works, Inc.** in the amount of \$142,720 for the **Muddy Creek Streambank Stabilization Project.**

Water and Wastewater Treatment

The Utility Commission approved a resolution supporting the **Yadkin-Pee Dee River Basin Association High Rock Lake Nutrient Strategy Development Project** to identify the cost of various Numeric Nutrient Criteria for wastewater treatment facilities within the High Rock Lake watershed.

The Utility Commission approved a change order to **State Utility Contractors, Inc.** in the amount of \$292,040 for the **Muddy Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant Clarifier Upgrades.**

The Utility Commission awarded a contract to **MWH Constructors, Inc.** in the estimated amount of \$51,064,545 for the **Muddy Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant Consolidated Influent Pumping Improvements Project.**

General

The Utility Commission approved the minutes from the November 10, 2014 commission meeting.

The Utility Commission adopted revisions to Section 26 of the **Sewerage System Policy**; also known as the **Good Neighbor Policy**. These revisions recommends that claims for sewer backups which are caused by blockages that occur in the service line, between the utilities maintained cleanout and the mainline within the public right-of-way/easement and are deemed unavoidable and beyond the reasonable control of the property owner may be considered under the Good Neighbor Policy on a case-by-case basis.
